

In Maths, we have started our second block of multiplication and division. This past week, we have been revisiting some of the concepts that were taught over lockdown and encouraging children to utilise the maths equipment to support them in their fluency.

In English, we have begun our text study. The children have thoroughly enjoyed reading 'Escape from Pompeii' and learning all about the history of the city. They have been able to retrieve
