Learning this week

WELCOME BACK!

It has been wonderful being back in school and seeing all of the children. They have all returned with eagerness and enthusiasm.

In English we have been exploring the text Holes. We have been refreshing some of our retrieval skills and looking at how character emotions are described to show, rather than tell,



the reader what a character is feeling.

We have enjoyed recapping how to write successful diaries in English and look forward to writing our own this week.

Our Maths unit has been focused on algebra. We have been looking at simple one-step function machines, formulae and equations. They have used strategies to find the functions using trial and improvement or considered the pattern of differences. Children have been introduced to conventions that we use when writing algebraic expressions. e.g. y × 4 is written as 4y.

In our Marvellous Maya Topic we have located where they lived and have been making comparisons to the Mayan civilization with the British civilization timeline. In science we experimented with Skittles and Jelly babies to explore diffusion and osmosis—very technical!
