Learning this week

In maths this week, we have been learning about how to measure and calculate perimeter. To challenge ourselves further, we were working hard to convert measurements into mm, cm and m.

In English, we have been writing an ending to a story. We have watched only part of it and thereafter came up with an ending. We had so many ideas! We have used all that we have previously learnt, such as interesting sentence openers, speech and some powerful vocabulary.

In our topic sessions, we have explored light; how it is reflected from different surfaces, how we can block light and create shadows and how the shadow change throughout the day. In our next lessons we will explore plant's life cycle.
