# **School Council**

We are pleased to announce that the School Council has been formed for this academic year, taking two representatives from each class group to come together to be the pupil voice in decision-making for the school. We are very proud of all pupils that put themselves forward as a nominee for School Council and made a speech as to why they should be voted for by their fellow class members.

The first meeting was held at the beginning of this month. The pupils were able to feedback on Marvellous Me, we will be sharing this data with you at Parents Consultation. The pupils also shared their thoughts on Pokemon cards and fiddle toys, with the changes we have since made from this important input of our young people.

We are soon to appoint a Chair, Vice Chair and Secretary and Vice Secretary to take on the roles needed to run the School Council this year with the support of Mrs Rae-Shearing.



### Self-Regulation

Self-regulation can be defined in various ways. In the most basic sense, it involves controlling one's behaviour, emotions, and thoughts in the pursuit of long-term goals

We are working hard to develop our understanding of this and encourage our children to be really good at it.

### Self-Regulation Room

We have created a space in school to support self-regulation and are continually reviewing its effectiveness.

A child might be asked to join a regulation session at lunchtime if their behaviour during lessons needs a discussion about how it could improve. They may also be asked to go to this room if there is an incident on the playground that means they need to regulate.

The session will be a constructive and positive one with discussion about strategies to:

- support self-control
- > regulate emotions
- be aspirational
- make changes for the better

## Staffing Update

We have had a number of changes to the staff team this term, as follows:

#### **Midday Team**

Mrs Wilkey left the Midday team to start a new role elsewhere and Mrs Hanks is now working as an LSA in school. We have appointed Ms Mbabazi to join us as well as Mrs Hands (who will hopefully start very soon).

We have also appointed new members to the catering team and the office this week and we look forward to welcoming them to the Howbridge family soon, too.



#### **COVID Measures - Latest**

We are closely following Essex County Council's advice and guidance around COVID-19. The advice they give is aligned to Public Health England. This includes keeping classrooms ventilated and maintaining hand-washing and additional cleaning.

Although we are not required to, when we are notified that a member of the school community has had a positive PCR test result, we are sending the County model letter to parents.

Track and Trace have been in touch with me this week and have commented that our cases are low at the moment in comparison to many schools. However, they have warned us that cases may spike and fall over the coming months. I will remain in contact with all agencies to ensure I get the latest guidance and let you know if we need to make any changes in school.

One of the actions you can all take to help reduce the spread of COVID-19, and thus keep our school open, is to take a Lateral Flow Test when you know you are coming into school e.g. for parent consultations or an event such as a production.
